I like baked beans on toast and strawberry milkshake. We eat to help us grow and keep us healthy and to run fast.





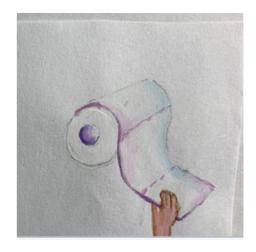
The food is absorbed from the tubes that go through our tummies, called bowels. The food that is left over and we don't need comes out of our bottoms as poo.

After they poo, people wipe their bottoms with soft toilet paper, just enough to keep their bottoms clean. If there is a lot of poo I can ask a grown up to help me.

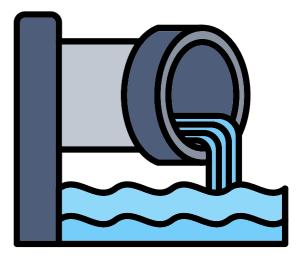




Most people need to do a poo every day, and afterwards they flush the toilet. The water comes in with a woosh.
